Moment of Forgiveness

Symbol: It is suggested to put this year's LOGO on a large poster. On it we will place three footprints as we say each of these requests for forgiveness.

Reader: Sometimes we get tired of walking. In the group we have walked together, climbing mountains, visiting incredible places. And sometimes we have been impatient, wanting to reach the goal as soon as possible. For our impatience, that we may learn to respect your times, LORD HAVE MERCY.

Reader: At other times we walk in haste, wanting to be first, to arrive before others... and we have left people behind... we have not realized that they needed us, that we have discouraged them with our impetus of wanting to arrive first. Because of our forgetfulness of those for whom the way is more difficult, CHRIST, HAVE MERCY.

Reader: Finally, we recognize that at times we have forgotten that you were always with us, Jesus, that you were with us in the good times, but above all in the bad times. And then, we would go astray and lose our way on false paths. For not letting you be our shepherd and guide, LORD, have mercy.

Mass Readings

Introduction to the readings:

We have chosen readings that speak of hope. To educate is to have hope. To live in the Calasanz movement is to live in Hope. That is why we remember how the prophet Isaiah encouraged all the people and invited them to walk with joy, trusting in God.

Jesus also has the same hope, and he would dare to say that he himself can bring hope to the world. And if Jesus did it, why can't you and I do it? Let us listen carefully and encourage each other to bring much-needed hope to the world.

First Reading:

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.25, 6-9

On this mountain the LORD of hosts
will provide for all peoples
A feast of rich food and choice wines,
juicy, rich food and pure, choice wines.
On this mountain he will destroy
the veil that veils all peoples,
The web that is woven over all nations.
He will destroy death forever.
The Lord GOD will wipe away
the tears from all faces;
The reproach of his people he will remove
from the whole earth; for the LORD has spoken.
On that day it will be said:
"Indeed, this is our God; we looked to him,
and he saved us!
This is the LORD to whom we looked;

GOSPEL

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 4, 16-21

He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went, as was his custom, into the synagogue on the Sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes

of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."
